

Soon the King is Coming!

Into the chaos and confusion of our times the Christmas message of hope rings out loud and clear. Jesus came, and Jesus is coming again – this time as King. Soon the King is coming. But are we ready?

In the run-up to Christmas some think of business profits, shopping, gifts, decorations, and celebrations. Others think of Bethlehem asleep, the star in the sky, shepherds in the field and singing choirs of angels.

The real Christmas message goes far deeper. The world is fast approaching the last greatest event: the return of Jesus. He is coming again as King of kings in glory and majesty. Every eye will see Him, the only-begotten Son of the Father and perfect image of God.

> From highest heaven Jesus our Sovereign comes! Surrounded by His angels in glory He appears. The Bride is filled with yearning, the King does come! She hastens forth to join with Him, He is her only love.

When will Jesus come? At midnight, when it is completely dark on earth – in the age of death, when creation is dying and falling into decay, when society is being destroyed by war, violence and depravity. While sin reigns, death has its biggest harvest yet.

But when Jesus comes as King, the great reversal will happen. Don't our hearts skip a beat at the mere thought?

What does this reversal look like? When Jesus comes again, He will set everything right. That appeals to us.

Certainly, He is wonderful in counsel. As His plan of salvation continues to unfold, He is leading everything to a successful conclusion. The nations will come under His dominion. Restoration will come to the universe and in the end there will be a new heaven and a new earth.

But there is another aspect to the return of Jesus that we may find challenging even as believers. When Jesus comes again as the Lamb of God, there will be a difference in how people see Him. Some looking at His face will see the wrath of the Lamb. A terrifying moment. The kings of the earth, the princes, the generals, the rich, the mighty, and everyone else will call to the mountains and the rocks, "Fall on us and hide us from the face of him who sits on the throne and from the wrath of the Lamb! For the great day of their wrath has come, and who can withstand it?" (Revelation 6:16–17) Others will see His face radiant with love as the heavenly Bridegroom.

So when Jesus comes again, He will reveal Himself in two ways: To some He comes as the Judge; to others He comes as the Bridegroom. The all-important question is: How will Jesus appear to me personally when He comes again? Will I see the wrath of the Lamb? Or His love and grace?

We may call ourselves believers, but if we have lived only for self, we may find ourselves like the foolish girls standing before a closed door when the Bridegroom returns (Matthew 25).

So how do I know if I belong to the wise girls? Jesus is asking us today, "Do you rejoice to see Me receive honour and glory? Are you grieved to see Me held in contempt? Do you suffer with Me at the falling away of so many today? What stirs your heart? Family and business affairs? Getting on in the world? Making a name for yourself? Or do you care for Me and the concerns of My heart?" If we want to share in the untold joy of the Marriage Feast of the Lamb, we will share here and now in His pain. The true Bride of Jesus does. Treating the future dismissively is not the way – "Oh, everything will work out in the end."

How do we acquire a single-hearted love for Jesus? It doesn't come automatically. Love for Jesus can only enter a heart that has made room for Him. Everything else has to go. Desire for recognition. Soulish attachments to people and the things of this world. If we want to see love for Jesus grow in us, we need to die to self.

Time is running out. So let us bravely die to self, making room for the love of Jesus in our hearts. This love will draw Him to us when He appears. The Bride of the Lamb only wants Jesus. She serves Him with a sacrificial love. She longs for the day He returns when all the heavens will resound with jubilant songs of praise.

Can we imagine such joy! Surrounded by myriads of angels, Jesus will appear in the clouds of the sky, His face alight with love, His arms outstretched to clasp us to His heart for ever.

Such hope enables us to endure in the sufferings of these end times. It also enables us to strengthen others. The more we love Jesus, the greater the joyful sense of expectancy: Soon the King is coming!

> Nothing more do I seek in a world about to collapse before my eyes. No more do I hear the cries of profanity, vice and terror.

Silver bells chiming, singing, ever singing, of heaven, a world so pure and beautiful awaiting the bride of Christ. A world of woe and pain she leaves behind. Transformed by suffering and fit for heaven, she now dons glorious apparel, the wedding gown for all eternity.

Jesus, the Hope of the world, is coming again. This is the Christmas star that lights up the darkness.


